

## II. ODA Plan by Priority Area of Cooperation

### 1 Regional Development

#### Development Needs

- The Ugandan government is working to **increase productivity in agriculture**, which is the key sector, improve market accessibility, and **enhance value addition in agricultural products**.
- The government is also actively pursuing improvement of road infrastructure and establishment of transport network system, primarily in the capital city of Kampala.
- As the largest refugee-hosting country in Africa, Uganda is implementing policies to support refugee-hosting communities based on the *Comprehensive Refugee Response Framework (CRRF)*.

\* Adopted the spirit of United Nations' CRRF, tailored to domestic situation (2017-Present)

#### Basic Directions

- In consideration of the nation's high dependence on agriculture, assist to increase farm household income based on growth in agricultural productivity by **developing overall value chain**
  - \* 80% of the households involved in agriculture (Uganda Bureau of Statistics, 2022)
- Ensure sustainability through **system improvement** and **capacity-building** of rural area residents as well as public officials in central and local governments, and other key stakeholders
- Assist to **build roads and other key infrastructure** for regional industrialization
- **Support the refugee response framework by improving living conditions and community infrastructure** for refugees

## □ Detailed Implementation Plan

- **(Tailored regional development model)** Design and apply the regional development model to broader regions by **drawing on Korea’s experience of the Saemaeul Undong (New Community Campaign)** and **customizing it in Uganda’s social and cultural context**
  - Enhance program effectiveness by building **the capacity of stakeholders** in local communities
- **(Development of industrialization infrastructure)** Facilitate balanced development and create linkages among regions through **improved transport infrastructure**, and **assist to build key infrastructure** such as electricity, water and sewage
- **(Integration of refugees into local communities)** **Assist refugees and local residents** to build income-generating capacity through **vocational training and entrepreneurship support**, and improve living conditions and community facilities

## 2 Education

### Development Needs

- The Ugandan government is working to **increase access to public education, enhance the quality of vocational training, and ensure greater efficiencies in education and training service deliveries.**

\* *Education and Sports Sector Strategic Plan (ESSP 2017-2020), Digital Agenda for the Education and Sports Sector* (announced in 2021)

- Set the goals to **achieve 98% of high school graduation rate, enhance teacher capacity, and increase research and development expenditures by 2021**
- Need to raise the **quality of vocational skills training, develop instructor capacity, increase digital education, and create an optimized ICT environment in line with industrial demand**

## □ **Basic Directions**

- Assist to **improve the quality of vocational skills training** in order to foster skilled technicians
- Improve the quality of education by building **teachers' capacity and increasing student participation** in education
- Enhance access to digital education, including **creating an environment suitable for ICT education**

## □ **Detailed Implementation Plan**

- **(Strengthen professionalism of vocational training and education) Enhance industrial demand-based vocational training and education to foster a skilled workforce** and improve the **capacity for entrepreneurship and employment**
  - **Develop vocational training and education curricula based on industrial demand** to foster a capable workforce
  - Improve the quality of education by **supporting instructor education and training**, and by **improving education tools and materials**
- **(Improvement of education quality) Expand access to secondary and higher education** and provide quality education through **teacher capacity building**
- **(ICT education environment) Construct new Digital Innovation Center**, and ICT equipment and supplies **Provide** Build the capacity needed for the future through

## Health & Hygiene

### Development Needs

- The Ugandan government is focused on **public health crisis management, including pandemic response, and response system improvement**

\* *National Action Plan for Health Security 2019-2023, etc.*

- Emphasize application of ICT technology in the health sector, including adoption of the hospital management information system and the regional health information system in the wider context
- The government is also pursuing improved access to water and sanitation facilities

### Basic Directions

- Assist to build the **capacity of key healthcare workers and improve medical facility infrastructure** to enhance access to primary healthcare services
- Provide assistance to enhance the system to respond to public health crisis by building **the capacity to deal with infectious diseases**
- **Support** to establish an advanced digital system in healthcare, including building the capacity **for innovative medical technology, ICT technology application, and system improvement**
- **Build facilities to provide safe drinking water and improve the overall related environment to prevent waterborne diseases and enhance primary public health**

### Detailed Implementation Plan

- **Advance the primary healthcare system, such as building capacity of and reputation of key health workforce, including those at the local level, improving the environment of healthcare facility, and enhancing the data management system**

- Assist to **build the capacity of infectious diseases responders, support facility and equipment, provide policy consulting, and improve the data management system for infectious disease outbreaks**
- Support to use ICT technology in order to **advance the digital medical system**, including the hospital management information system, and **build the capacity of healthcare workers** for innovative medical technology, including doctors with a specialized medical license
- Assist to improve **the environment for safe drinking water** (drinking water facility, hand washing facility, toilet, and supplies) and **organize hygiene education and awareness programs** in local communities

### III. Implementation Strategy

#### ODA alignment and harmonization

- Implement mid- to long-term **ODA strategies, focusing on priority areas and in conjunction** with the Ugandan national development plan and sectoral development plans
- In consultation with the Ugandan government, align the policies of both the Republic of Korea and Uganda, and create potential linkages among sectors from the program identification phase
  - \* Participation in Local Development Partners' Group (LDPG) and other regular development partner meetings (ADP, EDP)

#### Considerations of other partner-specific cross-cutting issues

- In addition to focusing assistance on key areas of cooperation, pursue ODA programs in consideration of climate change and gender equality
  - \* Expand ODA programs to cover the environment and climate change based on the Korean government's Green New Deal ODA Strategy (July, 2021)
